



NOTICE OF SCHOOL BUDGET HEARING

A public hearing of the qualified voters of the Berlin Central School District, Rensselaer County, New York, will be held at the **Berlin Elementary School Building** in said District on **June 8, 2010** at 7:00 PM prevailing time, for the presentation of the budget.

NOTICE OF SCHOOL BUDGET VOTE

This year the School District has been working in conjunction with the Rensselaer County Board of Elections to provide **machines for voting**. Voting will be held at the

Tuesday, June 15, 2010, from NOON – 9:00 PM.**

Qualified voters will be asked to vote on:

THE 2010-2011 BUDGET

The Budget for the 2010 – 2011 school year is not to exceed **\$18,281,716**. This is an increase of (zero) 0% in the tax levy.

PROPOSITION NO. 1

Proposition #1 is to purchase one (1) school bus; a 58-passenger/ 3WC track seating school bus and expend an amount not to exceed \$ 138,000.00, to be raised by the levy of a tax upon the taxable property of said School District and collected in annual installments as provided by Section 416 of the Education Law; and in anticipation of such tax, obligations of said School District shall be issued.

PROPOSITION NO. 2

Proposition #2 is to reconstruct, and construct improvements to district buildings, including all original furnishings, equipment, machinery, apparatus, appurtenances, site improvement, and incidental improvements and expenses in connection therewith, and is to expend an amount not to exceed \$100,000, to be raised by the levy of a tax upon the taxable property of said School District and collected in annual installments as provided by Section 416 of the Education Law; and in anticipation of such tax, obligations of said School District may be issued.

Applications for Absentee Ballots

Applications for absentee ballots can be requested by qualified voters if the voter is unable to appear in person to vote due to illness, physical disability, hospitalization; because of duties, occupation, business or studies outside of the county or town; vacation. Absentee ballot applications can be obtained from the District Clerk. Completed applications must be received by the District Clerk at least seven (7) days before the election if the ballot is to be mailed to the voter, or the day before the election, if the ballot is to be delivered personally to the voter. Absentee ballots must be received by the District Clerk by 5:00 PM, on **Tuesday, June 15, 2010**.
